Begin with a Broad Topic and Read/Research Across Multiple Texts









National Assessment of Educational Progress – 4th Grade Outcomes



“In the United States, public schools deliver 85% or more of their curriculum by reading textbooks, whiteboards, worksheets, and computer screens. Students must read well to do well. **It matters little what else they learn in elementary school if they do not learn to read at grade level.** Even math depends on reading. There are far more words than numbers in math books. As the math concepts become more complicated, the verbal descriptions become more involved as well.”


Relationship between 3rd grade reading and 8th grade math in Georgia

Mean 3rd Grade CRCT Reading




Relationship between 3rd grade reading and 8th grade math in Georgia





State Literacy Plan

Characteristics of service providers & population are receptive to each other





POSITIVE LEARNING CLIMATE

Scaling What Works



- 16 statewide trainings, over 3,500 teachers and administrators
- 298 schools and early learning projects in 43 districts
- 182,000 students
- 100% of elementary schools receiving SRCL funds saw increase in children performing at grade level in reading comprehension from 2014-2016

- Strong professional learning model




