

 access to, and opportunities for, a well-rounded education for all students;



Needs Assessment -Benefits



- Include partners and stakeholders
- Determine prioritization to distribute funds
- Improve overall effectiveness of SSAE program
- Identify gaps and root causes
- Define goals and objectives



Elements of Success








KEY BUDGET REMINDER -

LEAs receiving \$30,000 in SSAE program funds must use at least –

- 20% of funds for activities to support well-rounded educational opportunities
- 20% of funds for activities to support safe and healthy students
- A portion of funds for activities to support effective use of technology




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


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
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Healthy, Active Lifestyles

Drug and Violence Prevention Programs





Key Principles

- Tailor to address specific risk factors to population
- Design for early intervention to address risk factors
- Target improving social and academic learning
- Focus on key transition periods
- Reach populations in multiple settings
- Design to be long term with repetitive interventions

"For each \$1 invested in prevention, a savings of \$10 in treatment can be seen"

School Based Mental Health Programs




- Promote the healthy social and emotional development of all children and youth

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


