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# Homeless Education Data

# **Statewide Homeless Education Statistics**



- FY18 total number of McKinney-Vento Students was 41,089
- 40,216 School-aged McKinney-Vento students
- 875 identified McKinney-Vento pre-school students




#### **Statewide Homeless Education Statistics**

# General Overview McKinney-Vento Law



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Each local education agency liaison for homeless children and youth shall ensure that...

(ii) homeless children and youth enroll in, and have a full and equal opportunity to succeed in schools of that local education agency. [722(g)(6)(A)(ii)]

# **General Overview McKinney-Vento Law**



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SEAs and LEAs must develop, review and revise their policies to remove barriers to the enrollment and retention of children and youth in homeless situations. [722(g)(1)(I)]

- Immediate enrollment of homeless students, regardless of missing documentation.
- Transportation to and from the "school of origin."
- Homeless children and youth are not stigmatized or segregated on the basis of their status as Homeless.

### ESSA Requirements and McKinney-Vento



- States must have procedures to eliminate barriers to academic and extracurricular activities, including magnet school, summer school, career and technical education, advanced placement, online learning, and charter school programs. 11432(g)(1)(F)(iii)
- LEAs should anticipate and accommodate the needs of McKinney-Vento students to enter these programs and consider giving them priority on waitlists. Education for Homeless Children and Youths Program Non-Regulatory Guidance Title VII-B of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (Guidance)

### ESSA Requirements and McKinney-Vento



- SEAs and LEAs should develop policies to expedite full participation in extracurricular activities and work with athletic associations to adjust policies to facilitate participation. (*Guidance p. 25*)
- LEAs must have procedures to ensure McKinney-Vento students receive appropriate full or partial credit, such as: consulting with prior school about partial coursework completed; evaluating students' mastery of partly completed courses; offering credit recovery. 11432()(1)(F)(ii); 11432(g)(6)(A)(x); Guidance O2

### ESSA Requirements and McKinney-Vento



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- SEAs and LEAs should ensure school personnel consider issues related to homelessness prior to taking disciplinary action. (*Guidance p. 33*)
- SEAs and LEAs should provide training on the traumatic impacts of homelessness and how to provide trauma-informed support. (*Guidance p. 34*)

### Defining Roles for McKinney-Vento Student Support



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#### **Homeless Liaisons**

- Facilitate identification and immediate enrollment of McKinney-Vento students
- Coordinate student transportation needs
- Lead professional development administrators and school staff related to Homeless Education
- Coordinate comparable services and referrals to community partners on behalf of McKinney-Vento students and families

#### Federal Programs Administrators

- Work with Homeless Education Liaison to plan annual McKinney-Vento program budget
- Assess LEA needs for McKinney-Vento Professional Development
- Assist with coordination of comparable services
- Coordinate development of LEA McKinney-Vento policies and procedures with Homeless Education Liaison

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

### Defining Roles for McKinney-Vento Student Support



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- Distribute a checklist for McKinney-Vento student support (Registrars, Transportation, Principals)
- Hold staff training sessions in the fall and spring of each year
- Designate a staff lead contact for each administrative group to field questions
- Create a district schedule to highlight "McKinney-Vento Tips" for addressing student needs
- Enlist departmental support for developing McKinney-Vento FAQs and resource guides






## Enhancing Partnership Diversity



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### **Strategies for Enhancing Partnerships**



- Conduct an annual Engagement Assessment for McKinney-Vento partners
- Utilize community agency staff members by identifying internal partnership strengths (Consult with Development officers for Grant Writing Assistance)
- Conduct Skype and Virtual Meetings to evaluate MOU progress throughout the school year
- Send program updates and "Thank You" acknowledgements quarterly



#### **Strategies for Enhancing Partnerships with Limited Resources**





- Reserve office space for community resource providers at the LEA administrative offices or a designated school
- Form a transportation collaborative between McKinney-Vento parents and LEA faculty if allowable
- Utilize a faith-based collaborative and MOUs for student assistance needs
- Utilize local Health Departments and medical practitioners to promote McKinney-Vento awareness activities

# Developing Stakeholder Engagement Strategies





- Develop an LEA advisory committee to address McKinney-Vento and Foster Care planning (CLIP, Resource Coordination, Transportation, and Funding)
- Create a partnership protocol for communication of program accomplishments and needs
- Host a McKinney-Vento Open House with local businesses (hotels, storage facilities, dry cleaners)
- Participate in GaDOE technical assistance and professional development sessions

#### **Developing Stakeholder Engagement Strategies Georgia's School Superintendent** "Educating Georgia's Future"

- Host regional Homeless Education support meetings on a quarterly basis that include **Transportation Department** representatives and key personnel
- Share McKinney-Vento polices and forms via a shared drive (Dropbox or Google Docs)
- Develop a communication protocol to facilitate timely responses between districts
- Collaborate with neighboring districts and Homeless Education Liaisons quarterly to share best practices for budget development, policies, and procedures
